The Polish Heritage Club depends on members to volunteer their time, talents, and service to lead the organization, work to plan and carry out events, and communicate about the organization to members, the local community, and the state.

The club typically hosts or participates in a number of events every year:

- Spring Festival usually Palm Sunday
- International Festival at the Overture Center dates vary
- Portage County Cultural Festival spring
- Member Picnic August
- Christmas Market November
- Wigilia December
- Help is always needed to serve on planning committees, buy items for sale at the events, cook Polish lunches, work at check out, set up and clean up.
- The Club maintains a web site and Facebook page, produces a newsletter for members several times a year, and manages publicity for club activities as well as Polish-related events. Assistance is welcome to help develop content, manage and post to the applications, and coordinate publicity.
- The Club offers scholarships to students and welcomes individuals to oversee the process, review applications and make recommendations for funding.
- A Board of Directors leads the Club and invites interested individuals to apply. Directors generally have two-year terms. Financial management is critical to the ability of the club to sponsor events, so an annual audit is conducted to ensure funding availability and accountability to the members.
- > The Club occasionally sponsors events and activities such as classes, lectures, workshops, travelogues, and musical performances and welcomes members willing to share their experiences and talents for such activities.
